#### **Keynotes**

Cory Shaffer, Ph.D., CMPC

In this keynote, titled "Lessons from an Early Career Professional for an Early Career Professional," Dr. Cory Shaffer, CMPC shared his lessons learned from his first five years working in applied sport psychology, and the path he took to become a full-time applied performance consultant. Providing advice through the wisdom learned from his own experiences, Dr. Shaffer encouraged young professionals to: 1) Seek opportunities and experience, 2) adopt a growth mindset and continue learning, 3) practice what they preach, 4) be authentic in their work and to develop their own style, and 5) to be creative and think outside the box about how to provide value to their work

Scott Rogers, Ph.,D.

In this keynote, titled "Mindfulness in Law and Life: A Roadmap to Mindfulness and Mindful Practices," Dr. Scott Rogers, J.D. shared his experiences in finding mindfulness and how to implement it into a classroom of law students. He provided us with multiple practices of mindfulness meditation, and shared his knowledge of how the use of mindfulness can be transitioned to any aspect, in sports, the courtroom, personal lifestyle, etc.
