



Call for Papers “Sport Injury Psychology” Special Issue of the *Journal of Applied Sport Psychology*

Guest Editors

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Sport injury psychology is an area of research that continues to flourish and diversify in the applied sport psychology literature. The value and timeliness of this special issue lies in the increasing acknowledgement of the importance of this area of research in understanding how sport psychologists can work within the multidisciplinary team to assist towards preventing sport injury, supporting rehabilitation, and enabling a successful return to or away from sport.

The objective of this special issue is to bridge the gap between research and practice and translate emerging knowledge into an accessible and broad account of the field for practitioners. In line with the scope of JASP, an essential element of any submitted manuscript should be to further thought, theory, and research on applied aspects of sport injury psychology. Hence, we are interested in receiving submissions that report primarily empirical studies that are rigorous and *significantly* advance knowledge and understanding in the field, but we will also consider review and position papers. Topics for the special issue may include but are not limited to:

- Interdisciplinary research
- Novel epistemologies, theories, and methodologies
- Cultural and social environments that determine injury and rehabilitation
- Relational impact of injury on athletes’ support networks
- Mental health and well-being
- Embodied experiences of injury
- Innovative applied practices

Manuscript Submissions

Expressions of interest are invited in the form of a 200 - word abstract summarising the proposed submission to the *Journal Guest Editors* by 11th December 2020. Following review, authors will be invited to submit full versions of their manuscript for peer review by 1st June 2021. Manuscripts should be prepared in accordance with the *JASP* “instructions to authors” guidelines ([for complete instructions for authors, click here](#)). *JASP* receives all manuscript submissions electronically via their ScholarOne Manuscripts website located at: <http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/uasp>.
